Procedure

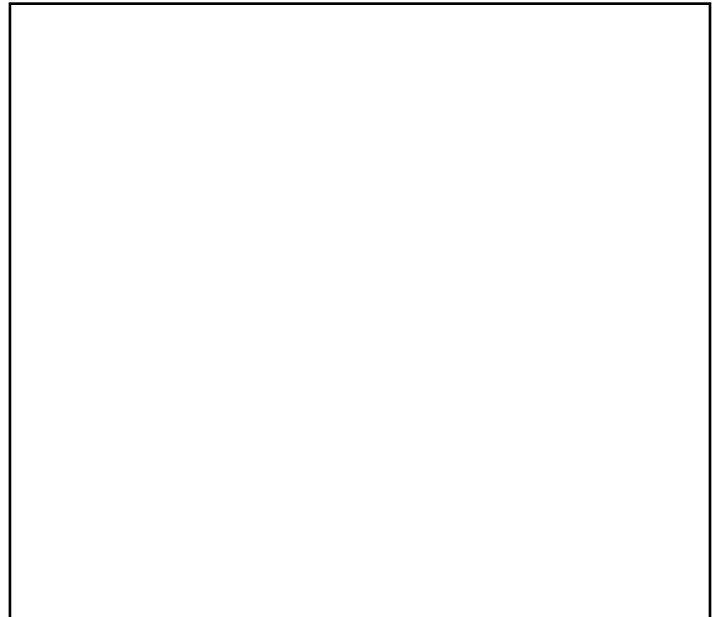
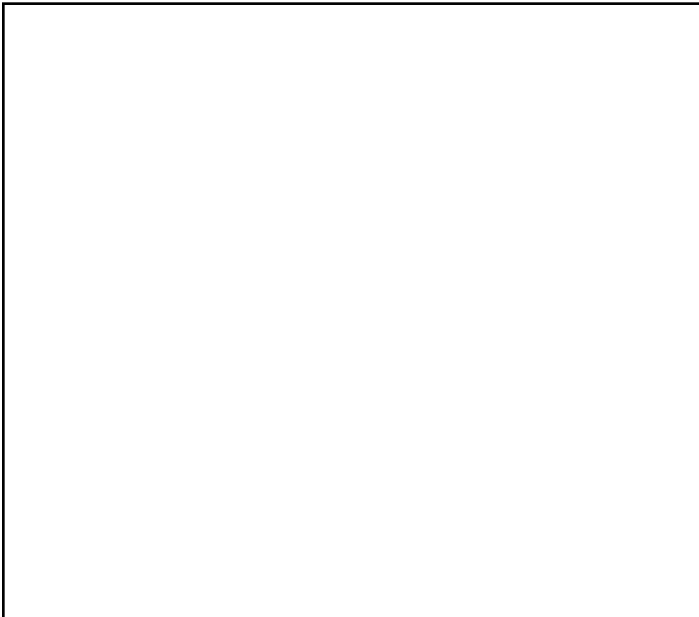
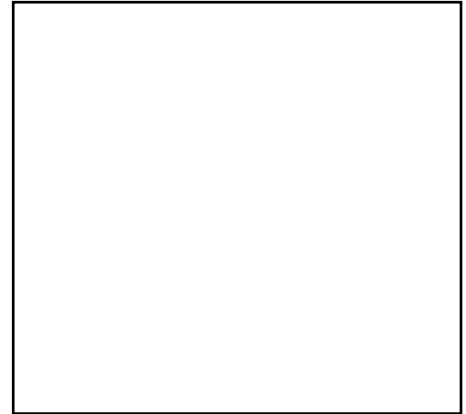
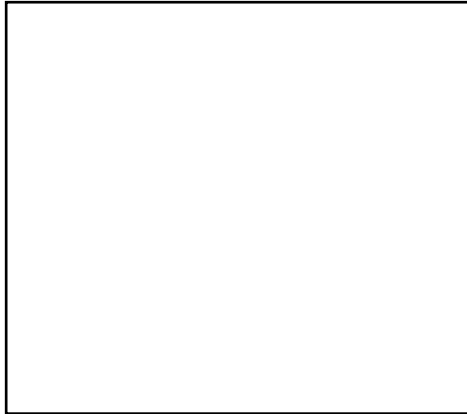
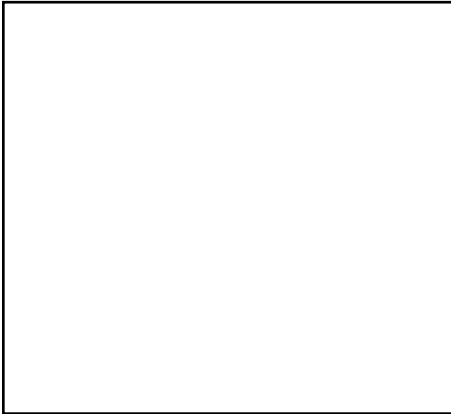
1. Choose one story worksheet (attached on the next pages).
